SAS® – A Rapid Introduction

A lecture / demonstration introduction to SAS® as a language for data management and analysis. After this session, participants will understand the power of the language, and the basics of accessing, managing, analyzing, and presenting data using SAS®. Open to all; limited to 70; no cost. SAS® in Depth

A small group hands-on class in the basics of SAS®. Participants will use SAS® to access, manage, analyze, and present data. A total of 16 seats available. Mentors will be available to assist participants during the sessions. Prerequisites: experience with Windows, but no statistical background. No cost. Registration required.
